Dear Friend,

On behalf of the Advisory Board, I'm very proud to once again mark the birthdate of C.B. Kern with our 6th Annual Report of The Carl B. Kern Fund. Each year there seems to be new and exciting activities to report, and 1993 is no exception.

One of the highlights of this past year was the Fund's first Annual Dinner, held June 16th at the Lebanon, Ohio's Countryside YMCA. The Y's hospitality and the attendance of over 60 people combined for a memorable evening which included the presentation of a \$2,100 check to Camp Kern Operations Manager John Fiely for camperships, words of praise for Minor 'Bud' Neff, Jed Whitaker, and Anne Trowbridge, for whom memorial and honorary gifts were contributed in 1993, a tribute to Larry Maxwell with the establishment of a Campership Fund in his name, and recognition for the Fund's first Heritage Members, Mr. and Mrs. George E. Kuhn.

The Fund's market value continues to grow. Detailed quarterly reports from The Dayton Foundation have been summarized and are presented herein for your review. Including the Larry Maxwell Campership Fund, a record \$8,870 was donated in 1993 to be applied to the principal of The C.B. Kern Fund. Since the Fund began in 1987, \$41,180 has been received in gifts as of December 31. A total of \$5,001 has been distributed in grants, and even after deducting additional Trustee and Foundation fees, the end-of-year market value of the Fund still stands at \$43,367, illustrating the increasing impact of the Fund's endowment-type growth.

1993 has witnessed a number of changes and challenges at YMCA Camp Kern, the recipient of the Fund's distribution checks to date. Throughout these times, the Advisory Board of The Carl B. Kern Fund has remained committed to the purposes of the Fund - 1) honoring the memory of "C.B." Kern and the morals / values which he represented, and 2) perpetuating his life work in the area of organized camping, which he firmly believed had the potential to provide powerful, positive experiences in the lives of developing youth. The Advisory Board would like to express our most sincere gratitude to all who have helped us pursue this commitment. We value the trust you have placed in us to oversee these goals, and we welcome any questions or comments you may have to offer. Thank you very much.




